Gimme Shelter is a juried, all-media art and fine craft show to be exhibited Oct. 24, 2009 thru Jan. 3, 2010, at the Johnson-Humrickhouse Museum (JHM), located in Roscoe Village, Coshocton. The show will be judged and prize money, awarded. The show includes a Youth Category for artists 18 and under.

Specifications:

Entrants may submit up to three works in any media. Entry fee is \$20.00. Jury review is by CD or slide. Artwork must be available Oct. 13, 2009—January 10, 2010.

Two-dimensional works must be ready to hang and not exceed a width of 48 inches. Three-dimensional works must not exceed 78 in. high or 32 in. wide, and weigh more than 150 lb.

JHM will be supporting Coshocton County Habitat for Humanity with sale commissions, calculated at 25% of the sale amount. Price your art to include this.

Image Format:

You may submit two images for each entry—an overall view and a detail. Mark title of each entry and the entry number (#1, #2, #3) on slide or in CD. Detail image should be marked as such. Each slide must be mounted in the standardized carousel compatible 2” x 2” plastic or paper mounts (no glass), and indicate top of image by writing “top” on slide. Slides/CDs of non-accepted work will be returned if a self-addressed stamped envelope is supplied.
